#### History, objectives and activities of the Charitable Incorporated Organisation

The Club is a member of the International Association of Lions Clubs and was established as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) on 15<sup>th</sup> February 2018. The CIO was formed out of the Club's Charitable Trust and the Club's Administration Fund, which have been chartered by the Lions Clubs International since 1974.

The Objects of the Club are such purposes as are exclusively charitable in England, including in particular:

the advancement of citizenship by promoting the principles of good citizenship.

- encouraging members to take an active interest in the civic, cultural, social and moral welfare of the community.
- providing a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest provided that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by members.
- encouraging service-minded people to serve their community without personal reward and encouraging the promotion of high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works and private endeavours.
- supporting youth to develop their skills, capacities and capabilities to enable them to participate in society as mature and responsible individuals.
- promoting the Voluntary Sector for the public benefit by associating with local authorities in a common effort to advance education and provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation
- to improve the conditions of life of people in local, national and international communities

#### promoting volunteering

- the relief of poverty and the relief of those in need. In particular, by providing humanitarian aid and disaster relief
- the advancement of health or the saving of lives by preventing avoidable blindness, assisting disabled people to lead independent lives, or helping to prevent or manage health issue

promoting for the benefit of the public the conservation protection and improvement of the physical and natural environment; and promoting community participation in healthy recreation.

Throughout the year, the Trustees have paid regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit in dealing with the objectives and activities of the Club.

The Club relies on the surpluses made on fundraising events, on donations from the public and other organisations, along with grants from local government, to provide the funds with which to carry out its objectives. All administrative expenses of the Club are met from subscriptions paid by its members. There has been no change in these policies during the year.

The work of the CIO is carried out entirely by volunteers.

From time to time as appropriate, the Club works closely with other local and national agencies, with other Lions Clubs, and with Lions Clubs International to achieve its objectives.

# Management and governance arrangements

The Club is governed by its CIO Constitution and by the Constitutions and By-Laws of Lions Clubs International, as revised from time to time.

The Trustees are appointed in accordance with the CIO Constitution and By-Laws, by the members of the Club, and they have overall responsibility to ensure that the Club operates in accordance with Charity law and the Club's CIO document. The day-to-day running of the Club is overseen by the Trustees, and they form and organise such committees as it deems appropriate for the effective running of the Club. All business of the Club is ratified by the members in general (Club) meetings, which meetings are held at least once per month.

The Club is ably supported by the volunteer services of its members and others.

#### **Trustees**

Details of the Trustees who have served throughout the reporting period are set out at the front of this report and accounts. The Trustees meet at least once a month.

## Financial review, investment policy, reserves and risk

The Trustees present their accounts for the period ended 30th June 2022. Income for the period was £113975 as shown in the Statement of Financial Activities.

This is 159% up on the previous year. Fundraising activities have still been partly limited in the year as the early part was still under pandemic regulations, limiting income. We continued with our main objective, to serve our community and a wider world where we assisted the Lions International Foundation. Grants and Donations are listed in Accounts under Note.8. Club projects continued where possible thanks to generous donations by the public, local government, and others. All funds raised are ready for donating, thus no risk is involved, and no reserves required other than a working balance to fund the current events and projects. It is not thought necessary to make any investments.

The Club maintains financial assets in Current Bank accounts with its main Bank being HSBC. The Club has no long-term commitments, other than a twenty-five year lease with Fleet Town Council, as all available funds are for immediate donation or use in the case of other assets. The Trustees do not consider a long-term Investment policy is currently required. Other Current Assets are maintained mainly for use within the Lions Community Store, being two commercial vehicles and some plant. Other assets include the Club's Father Christmas Sleigh and sound equipment and a Portakabin that is a workshop and store for the Recycle IT Project.

It is the policy of the Club to maintain restricted funds as well as unrestricted funds to the extent that donations and some Club funds have been donated or allocated for specific objectives of the Club. The adequacy of the reserves policy is reviewed annually. The Club also maintains its own funding of administrative costs and therefore maintains these within a restricted fund.

The Trustees have considered the major risks to which the Club is exposed to satisfy themselves that systems are in place to mitigate those risks. The pandemic curtailed activity but we have been able to increase in many areas.

### **COMMUNITY SERVICE ACTIVITIES**

Much has been achieved this year with Club members being active within the community. Fleet Phoenix Youth Charity has again been supported with its Summer Project for disadvantaged young people in the 2021 Summer holiday. Due to the pandemic funds have overlapped with a second grant advanced earlier for Summer 2022.

We work with the community for the community. Our ringfenced projects also continue community work with **Lions Community Store** as our long-term major project, supported by the other Clubs within our area. This project collects, sorts, and

redistributes household items for those who need help in establishing a home. Another main project is that of providing free blood tests for men to detect prostate cancer, the **Prostate Screening Fund.** We have continued with a DIY system, set up so men can carry out their own test at home. Also, a fund to help in paying utility bills for those that are unable to meet this cost, **The Wenceslas Project, renamed The Fuel/Utilities Project**. This being funded by donations from the community and distributed through local charities such as Citizens Advice, Fleet Phoenix, and the Hart Foodbank.

We also have a road sign project and with our volunteers and stock of road signs we assist the community with road closures. Known as the **Fleet Lions Temporary Traffic Management Team** they assist at Fleet Carnival, Remembrance Sunday, and Fleet Christmas Festival in November. We also hire out to responsible organisations in the area, for a small donation.

The **Lions Recycle IT**, coordinated by Fleet FLOGS Branch with other local Lion Clubs, has gone from strength to strength. This has been very successful and has proved again to be vital to current needs, with Ukrainian refugees now being helped as well as children. New Restricted Funds have been needed in the year. We organised a **Ukrainian Appeal** to send donations to the Polish Lion Clubs, through Lions Clubs International, so they could help Ukrainians arriving in Poland. The money raised was £3912 and was added to from our general funds so we were able to send £5265. Our **Trees for the Queen's Green Canopy** project involved local Junior Schools in raising funds and participating in the planting in school grounds and local parks. Due to kind donations by parents and local government we have been left with a balance that is being channeled into the local area for more tree planting.

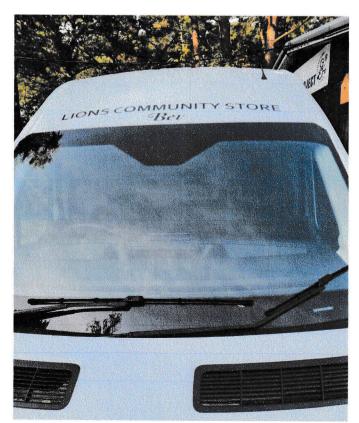
On an international level we donated, through both Lions Clubs International Foundation and British Isles Multiple District, £500, for initiatives with Blood Research in the UK and the Ukrainian Appeal (as above) with a further £1000 going to Eye Camps and Water Well Projects. Further over 5000 redundant spectacles have been collected and dispatched to Chichester Lions for sorting and onward transportation to other countries for use by their opticians, an initiative known as **Spektrek**. Another Lions Clubs initiative of **Message-in-a-Bottle** has also kept clinics and people supplied. This is a small container that houses a record of an individual's medicines and is kept in a marked place so paramedics can access if necessary.

Internationally we have donated to Lions Clubs International Foundation to help with their work with Water Aid and Eye Camps. Also, donations have been made to Disaster Appeal for Ukraine, inviting donations from the community to add their contribution. Nationally, through LCI MD105 British Isles, a contribution to Lions LIBRA blood cancer research has been made. Aldershot Branch has also contributed to Ukraine Appeal as well as the Hunger Appeal. The LIBRA fund's work is at Kings College Hospital, Haematology Department.



# **Lions Community Store**

The Store has been building back its work from the start of 2022. There has been a recruitment of new volunteers and we much appreciate their work. It cost £11572 to be able to carry out this vital community work, in the year. We undertake to lead on the project, with help and financial support from other local Lion Clubs. It should be noted from our Restricted Funds Report, under Note 13, that there has been a tremendous response to our various appeals on behalf of the Store. Firstly, we have had to appeal for the replacement of one of the two vans we use to operate. The van had made some heavy demands on funds, so we needed help. Provision had already been made for some funds to be kept for the purpose but a lot more was needed. The response by local government councilors has been terrific, with some companies also stepping up with help. At the start of the Fiscal Year (1st April) we were able to enter into an agreement to support Hart District Council Housing Solutions Department. This has given funds to use in the best way possible and allowed us to purchase a replacement van, in our new year. The work continued and we were again able to distribute the Christmas Hampers in December 2021. Wave Radio has given us a grant to use, over two years, to purchase children's clothes. The support we receive is tremendous. The Trustees, set up a steering committee with two trustees directly involved, taking members from all local Clubs. #### Aldershot Lions Branch

Aldershot Lions Club members have helped serve the local community through the difficult months and now through the start-up of regular activities. Various fundraising has been organised with a Chocolate Tombola in November followed by more sweet events at Yateley Fair and Victoria Day. Assistance was given with the Tea Tent at Armed Forces Day in June. They have made donations to the Lions Community Store for teenager Christmas presents and helping the Store with the packing at Morrisons Aldershot of Christmas hampers. Donations were made to Parkside Gateway for their Christmas Party. Two members are now helping at the newly opened Aldershot Grub Hub and a gift card had been given to the Hub to help. One of the Lion's two daughters sky dived for Alzheimer's Research and the Club helped with a donation. Other community work was carried out with stewarding at the Multi-faith Christmas Carol Concert and attending the Zone Lions' Funfest for disabled people and their families. Membership of the Club has increased by three, this year, and ten members received their ten year service badge. #### F.L.O.G.S. Branch

The senior Lions from Fleet have continued to coordinate the initiative Lions Recycle IT, which through their good services of raising grants and donations to funds has resulted in it being a great project serving the community. It started by providing free computers to local non-profit organisations, charities, preschools, and families in need, with a free computer that has been refurbished and cleaned and loaded. The pandemic brought increasing demand from local schools and parents. Now they are helping Ukrainian Refugees by providing laptops with the keys changed to Cyrillic letters. The Branch also assist the main club members in their fundraising and philanthropic activities, recently organizing the Oktoberfest, after a break for the pandemic.

#### **FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES**

The fundraising activities had to again be curtailed. Father Christmas visited as many areas as possible, in the east of the town, to give the children some enjoyment and to collect some much needed, donations. Collections and work with the Sleigh are shared with Hart Lions Club. Any resultant funds raised at Christmas go to fund the Christmas Hampers which provide much needed food items for those unable to afford them, especially at this time of year. These hampers were distributed by the **Lions Community Store**.

Again, a victim of the pandemic, the Annual Beerfest 2021 was cancelled. You will

now know that we were able to re-start the Beerfest in 2022. Also, due to its "openair" venue we were also able to stage our biggest fundraiser, the Firework Fiesta. Fireworks also got another outing with the Fleet Town Council funding a firework display to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. The Jubilee was celebrated over three days and the Fleet Lions were able to participate on all three days and raised much needed funds.

A senior citizens' Tea Party was arranged at the Church Crookham Community Centre and was supported by the Parish Council and Principle Care Homes (PCH). A commemorative mug was presented by PCH to each attendee.

# **FUTURE PLANS & OUTLOOK**

The Club will continue to support the community both proactively and when requested, the regular fundraising events are now underway and much needed funds will help to continue the work.

Our Community Service Team are working well as we put our local community at the heart of activities.

Volunteers are coming forward and this is the strength of our organisation. Through all our diverse projects and fundraising we have been able to establish a fine and willing team known as Fleet Lions Volunteer Team.

The volunteers help with fundraising (Fireworks needs a lot of helpers) as well as the Lions Community Store, loading and driving to deliver or collect, and marshalling as the Temporary Traffic Management Team.

As always, we will continue to promote our work through social media, not to seek praise but to interest more people and encourage them to volunteer and join us as members and thus enable the work to continue. # LIONS CLUB OF FLEET (CIO) NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE PERIOD 1st JULY 2021 – 30<sup>TH</sup> JUNE 2022

#### NOTE 1

#### **ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The Lions Club of Fleet (CIO) is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation registered with the Charity Commission in England and Wales No. 1177181.

#### a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, and the Charities SORP (FRS102) 2015 (Accounting and Reporting by Charities) and the Charities Act 2011.

These financial statements are prepared in GBP Sterling, rounded to the nearest pound, which is the functional currency of the Lions Club. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historic cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in these notes.

The Lions Club of Fleet (CIO) meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS102. The Trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the Lions Club's ability to continue as a going concern.

#### b) Incoming resources

Voluntary income, including donations, gifts, legacies and grants, are recognised where there is entitlement and certainty of receipt, and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability. Such income is only deferred when:

- The donor specifies that the grant or donation must only be used in future accounting periods; or
- . The donor has imposed conditions which must be met before the charity has unconditional entitlement.

Fundraising income and members' contributions are recognised when they fall due.

#### c) Volunteers and donated services and facilities

The value of services provided by volunteers is not incorporated into these financial statements. Further details of the invaluable contribution made by volunteers can be found in the trustees' annual report. Where services are provided to the Club as a donation that would normally be purchased from a third party, this contribution is recognised in the financial statements at an estimate based on the value of the contribution to the charity.

## d) Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised when a liability is incurred.

- · Costs of generating funds are those incurred in running fundraising events and in attracting voluntary income.
- Charitable activities include expenditure made in furthering the objectives of the Club, and in promoting volunteerism.
- Governance costs include those incurred in the governance of the charity and its assets and are primarily associated with constitutional and charity law requirements

## e) Tangible fixed assets

Assets costing £1000 or more are capitalised at cost.

Tangible assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided on all assets at rates calculated to write off the cost of the assets, on a straight-line basis, over its expected useful life.

#### f) Stocks

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### g) Cash at bank and inhand

Included within cash at bank and in hand there are no deposit balances.

### h) Foreign Currency Transactions

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to the statement of financial activities.

#### NOTE 2

#### **Taxation**

The Club is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation registered with the Charity Commission in England and Wales. therefore, it is exempt from taxation on its income and gains where they are applied for charitable purposes. The Club is registered for Gift Aid under HMRC Ref. EW90885.
